February 2, 2010

On motion by Councilwoman Hollowell, seconded by Councilman Simmons with all members present voting AYE, Council approved minutes, with correction, of a Regular City Council meeting held January 19, 2010.

ORDER # 10-044

ORDER: REQUIRING ALL CITY EMPLOYEES WITH VEHICLE DRVING PRIVILEGES TO FOLLOW STATE STATUE AND SIGN A COPY OF THE VEHICLE USAGE POLICY AND MAINTAIN THE COPY IN THE EMPLOYEE'S PERSONNEL FILE.

Attorney Alexander noted that item #4 on the agenda should be discussed as two separate issues, a) the use of city vehicles taken home by city employees and b) the use of city uniforms and equipment (including weapons) while performing part-time jobs not related to the City.

Atty. Alexander stated that this would be covered by the law prohibiting the Government from making a donation to its employees. The use of city vehicles is limited to usage to and from work, which may include lunch. Council has requested to be provided with a list of each employee having a take home vehicle.

On motion by Councilman Gines, seconded by Councilwoman Hollowell with all members present voting AYE, Council moved that all City employees driving city vehicles will be given the policy regarding the use of city vehicles and a signed copy of their acknowledgment made a part of the employee's personnel files.

ORDER # 10-045

ORDER: INSTRUCTING THE PUBLIC SAFETY AND HUMAN RESOURCE COMMITTEES TO DRAFT A POLICY FOR EMPLOYEE USE OF UNIFORMS AND/OR CITY EQUIPMENT WHILE ENGAGED IN WORK FOR ANOTHER ENTITY.

Item 4(b) relates to officers wearing city uniforms and utilizing city equipment while performing private duty jobs. A policy will be drafted in accordance with State Statute 17-25-11

requiring employees engaged in such employment to provide written notice to their immediate supervisor. Following, the Police Chief will present the applications to Council and approval will be granted on a case-by-case basis. Uniforms may only be worn within the jurisdiction of the uniform.

As well, it was recommended that area businesses, where officers are employed, sign documentation that indemnifies the City in case of an occurrence and names the City as an additional insured on their insurance policy.

On motion by Councilman Gines, seconded by Councilman Simmons with all members present voting AYE, Council moved to instruct the Public Safety and Human Resource Committees to draft a policy for the use of uniforms and/or city equipment while employees are working other part-time jobs.

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Resolution # 10-001

On motion by Councilwoman Hollowell, seconded by Councilwoman Weathers with all members present voting AYE, Council passed a Resolution for year 2010 General Obligation Bonds in the amount of \$2,000,000 for street improvements.

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Greenville, Mississippi (the "City"), took up for consideration the matter of raising funds for the purpose of financing certain capital projects of the City. After a discussion of the subject, Council Member Hollowell offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolution #10-001

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2010, OF THE CITY OF GREENVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, OR TO ISSUE A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND, SERIES 2010, OF THE CITY OF GREENVILLE, MISSISSIPPI FOR PURCHASE BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT BANK, ALL IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING CERTAIN CAPITAL PROJECTS AND IMPROVEMENTS WHICH SHALL CONSIST OF CONSTRUCTING, IMPROVING OR PAVING STREETS, SIDEWALKS, DRIVEWAYS, PARKWAYS, WALKWAYS OR PUBLIC PARKING FACILITIES, AND PURCHASING LAND THEREFOR; REPAIRING, IMPROVING AND EXTENDING SANITARY, STORM, DRAINAGE OR SEWERAGE SYSTEMS; AND FOR OTHER AUTHORIZED PURPOSES UNDER MISS. CODE ANN. §31-25-1 ET SEQ., AS AMENDED, AND MISS. CODE ANN. § 21-33-301 ET SEQ., AS AMENDED, INCLUDING PAYING FOR THE COST OF SUCH BORROWING; AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Greenville, Mississippi (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the City of Greenville, Mississippi (the "City"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

- 1. The City is authorized by Sections 21-33-301 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act") to issue general obligation bonds and is authorized by Sections 31-25-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Bank Act") and the Act to issue a general obligation bond to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank, both being hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purposes and amounts set forth in paragraph 2 of this preamble.
- 2. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue General Obligation Bonds, Series 2010 (the "G.O. Bonds") of the City or to issue a General Obligation Bond, Series 2010 (the "G.O. Qualified Obligation") of the City to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank, all in the principal amount not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) to raise money for the purpose of financing certain capital projects and improvements which shall consist of constructing, improving or paving streets, sidewalks, driveways, parkways, walkways or public parking facilities, and purchasing land therefor; repairing, improving and extending sanitary, storm, drainage or sewerage systems; and for other authorized purposes under Mississippi Code Ann. §31-25-1 et seq., as amended and Sections 21-33-301 et seq., as amended, including paying for the cost of such borrowing (the "Project").
- The assessed value of all taxable property within the City, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is Two Hundred Thirteen Million Two Hundred Fifteen Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety Three Dollars (\$213,215,893); the City has outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, in the amount of Five Million Five Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$5,530,000), and outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit), in the amount of Five Million Five Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$5.530,000): the issuance of the G.O. Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act or the G.O. Qualified Obligation hereinafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act and the Bank Act, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the City, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the City, and will not result indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the City, and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the City.
- 4. It is necessary for the health and well-being of the citizens of the City and it is necessary, proper and economically feasible that the City issue the G.O. Bonds pursuant to the Act or the G.O. Qualified Obligation to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank pursuant to the Act and the Bank Act, both for the purposes herein stated and under the procedures hereinafter set forth as provided by law.
- 5. The City reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation, respectively, upon the issuance thereof. This declaration of official intent to reimburse expenditures made prior to the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation in anticipation of the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation is made pursuant to Department of Treasury regulations Section 1.150-2 (the Reimbursement Regulations). The Project for which such expenditures are made is the same as described hereinabove. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for the Project is the amount hereinabove set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, ACTING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body hereby declares its intention to issue the G.O. Bonds pursuant to the Act or the G.O. Qualified Obligation to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank pursuant to the Act and the Bank Act, all in the principal amount not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) to raise money for the purpose of providing funds for the Project. The G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation may be issued in one or more series and will be general obligations of the City payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a direct and continuing tax to be levied annually without limitation as to time, rate, or amount upon all taxable property within the geographical limits of the City.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body proposes to direct the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank in the amounts, for the purposes and secured as aforesaid at the Governing Body's regular meeting place in the City Hall of the City, at the hour of 4:00 o'clock p.m. on March 2, 2010.

SECTION 3. If or on before 4:00 o'clock p.m. on March 2, 2010, ten percent (10%) of the qualified electors of the City or fifteen hundred (1500) whichever is less, shall file a written protest with the City Clerk against the issuance of the G.O. Bonds pursuant to the Act, or the issuance of the G.O. Qualified Obligation pursuant to the Act and Bank Act, then the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation for such purpose or purposes shall not be authorized unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance of such G.O. Bonds or G.O. Qualified Obligation to be called and held as provided by law. If no protest be filed on or before 4:00 o'clock p.m. on March 2, 2010, against the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation, then the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance or the authorization thereof at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall be published one (1) time per week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the *Delta Democrat-Times*, a newspaper published in the City and having general circulation therein and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation and the last publication shall not be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of the publication of this resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 6. The City reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation to be purchased by the Mississippi Development Bank, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation, respectively, upon the issuance thereof. This declaration of official intent to reimburse expenditures made prior to the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation in anticipation of the issuance of the G.O. Bonds or the G.O. Qualified Obligation is made pursuant to the Department of Treasury regulations Section 1.150-2 (the Reimbursement Regulations). The Project for which such expenditures are made is the same as

described hereinabove. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued or borrowed for the Project is the amount hereinabove set forth.

SECTION 7. If any one or more of the provisions of this resolution shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any of the other provisions of this resolution, but this resolution shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provision or provisions had not been contained herein.

Following the reading of the foregoing resolution, Council Member Weathers seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question to a roll call vote, and the result was as follows:
